From New York/GWB

Take exit #72A onto Rt. 4 West. (follow directions from 4 West)

From NJ Turnpike

Follow signs for I-95/I-80, Exit towards I-95 N. (follow directions from 80 East)



The 5 Year Club trip to see the new Scranton Yankees got rained out (after we arrived at the stadium), the July 4th Fireworks presentation set to Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture got rained out numerous times and even the MLB All-Star Game got postponed on several occasions. It didn't seem to be in the cards that baseball was going to happen this summer.

The trip to Binghamton was rather smooth....everyone had dinner at the concession stands (main course popcorn??)...our crowd was loud and certainly viewable on the JUMBOTRON screen. On Friday evenings at our shabbos service, campers and staff present a sermon. This is one from last summer. Joey Herman, a 2nd generation camper from Florida, will be entering his 7th summer as a Leader-In-Training in 2008.

The letters I longer asked questions about what I left behind in Florida but stories about the great time I was having at camp. My bunkmates quickly became my siblings with whom I could share everything, whether it was Visiting Day candy or problems and worries. After a great summer, I was crushed to leave camp. I knew one thing for sure, though; I would come back to Towanda for as many years as I was able to.

And so it began; my annual ritual of counting down the days to camp would consume my winter until, yet again, I got the chance to come back to Towanda. They say that time flies when you're having fun, but personally when you are in a place as special as this, time can work against you. The memories of being a junior in bunk 3 were being overtaken by the apprehension of being an Inter. I learned to cherish each and every moment of my summers so as to live camp to the fullest. I knew I had to remember everything because having the experience of camp is a privilege that not everyone has.

As I stand here tonight reading this sermon to you, I want you all to dig deep and find some of those memories that may have slipped under the rug. Everyday I look around camp and remember all the great things that haven happened to me because of Towanda. When I look at the Middies, I see my entire bunk playing Quidditch on Boys Campus; I see Jon Yung refusing to clean and telling us to stop complaining when I think about my National year; I see and hear the numerous bunk meetings we had last year when I watch the boys currently in 1110; and finally, when I look at my bros in the back row from The Club, who I have laughed and cried with, a smile comes across my face. I remember all the good times I have shared with them and how much they mean to me. I think of how much they care about me and all of the obstacles they helped me to overcome.

For the past six years, those boys have been my brothers and role models. For the rest of my life they will be my best friends. With the help of my bunkmates I broke the shell of the nervous, shy child I mentioned before and became the person that had the courage to stand before you and talk about how much of a driving force camp is in my life. For the rest of my life, no matter where fate takes me, I will always cherish the moments I have shared with all of you at Towanda. And to my Club brothers, I just want you all to know that you mean the world to me and no matter how often in the future we may meet, the bond we have will never be broken. Towanda will always be my home away from home and everybody sitting with me tonight, whether I knew you for a second or as long as I've been here, will forever be my family. Thank you!




Welcome to the Jummer of 2
