Alana Pines, our camp president, completed her Dorm Year this past summer as well as the quest for the Pine-asty, the 3rd Pines' sister to become President of Camp Towanda. She did not let us down, She and co-president, Cousin Joey Goret, cut the Visiting Day ribbon with precision, astonishment and laughter! Alana spoke before the entire camp during one of our Friday Evening Services:

Every summer since before I can remember, my dad has wanted to take a family trip. Of course, that plan never went through due to both my sister's and my passion for Camp Towanda. Once I started, in the summer of 2002, there was no stopping me. Before my Camp Towanda journey even began, I already knew that it would be the perfect place for me. I would repeatedly watch the Towanda highlights videos and beg my older sister, Dani, to tell me every minute of her past summers here. When my parents finally decided I was ready to go, I was a Dillie. I was a shy, nine-year-old girl, hardly knowing anything about the adventure I was about to begin; but at the same time I was eager to become part of the Camp Towanda family. All winter, I would wait for the last week of June to step onto that plane and arrive at my summer home. The plane ride, lasting a mere two and a half hours would seem like two and a half days. Although cliché, the minute I stepped off the bus, I knew I was home, jumping into the arms of friends who I haven't seen for ten months.

Its funny how the bond with my camp friends can be so steadfast and unchangeable. No matter how many months we've spent apart, I arrive at camp and it feels like we never left. I can probably relate to all of you when I say that I try to explain things to my home friends, but they never seem to understand anything about Camp Towanda. Through all of our experiences together, I have learned to laugh through the tears, cherish every moment I have here, and build and keep strong friendships that I know will never fade.

The other day, on my way to an activity, I passed two Deb girls playing a hand game. As they smiled and laughed uncontrollably, all I wanted to do was tell them how lucky they were. Those girls, sitting right in front of me, still have seven summers left to experience what Towanda really means. It's hard to comprehend that I have finally reached my dorm summer. Although I wish that I could go back to the start, I can't help but feel extremely grateful for the Camp Towanda experience with my thirty-five sisters and twenty-seven brothers. Take a look back 20 summers ago to 1990, our first year at Camp Towanda. Jared was 1. There was astroturf on most staircases, steps, docks and walkways, the old boathouse was just a few feet away from the crib section of the lake (no beach, no pool), the baseball diamonds were gravel, telephone poles dotted the landscape, the Mess Hall was a tad smaller, the bbq grill was hooked up to gas, The Canteen had no pennants, the RecHall was the Social Hall which housed our plays on stage (now the weight room), the current Arts & Crafts building was The Gymnasium, the current Staff Movie Lounge was Arts & Crafts, the Bike Shop was the Staff Lounge, Stephanie's Garden was The Riflery Range, The Boys Steps to the Mess Hall were white and located under The Chateau, Boys Volleyball was where Ga-Ga is now, Field Hockey was a paved Volleyball Court with large drainage basins around it, the main Tennis Courts had grass in between the courts, Friday Nite Flix began as CTV, our ski program was a silver rowboat with a motor, Visiting Day lunch was a box lunch of fried chicken, what is now the Field House and the Golf Driving Range was no-man's-land. The Office was a small shed where the Courtyard is now, laundry was located in The Alley, Ernie drove a sports car, Mitch didn't have (much) gray hair and Bob was at camp!

Camp has been the location of a crazy college movie, a great parody on late night TV and of course, the central theme of Friday Nite Flix. Our alums have gone onto illustrious and rewarding careers on stage, screen, music, court and candy to education and homemaking.

We have had tons of laughter, tremendous pride and even some tears. We have watched young Debs and Jets turn into Group Leaders, young staff become parents, alumni send their children, traditions continue to build and life at Camp Towanda remains the same... the way life used to be...not caught up, not a competition, just a giant family where one discovers a lot about themselves and how to learn, grow, love and get along with others while trying new things, safely leaving their comfort zone, taking healthy risks, improving developing and overall experiencing the best privilege there is...life at Camp Towanda.

When one looks back on their life and experiences, usually the best times were had right here...at Camp Towanda..... simply, the place to be, an incredible experience and privilege that we are truly grateful for. We are honored to be entrusted with the responsibility this generation.






